

### ACTIVITIES TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY EACH PARTY


- 1.1. The obligations of Dusters are as follows:
  - 1.1.1. Identification of students for the up skilling or training and development program
  - 1.1.2. Identification of module / curriculum for the employee development program
  - 1.1.3. To continue to provide its personnel with the monthly remuneration and other employment benefits such personnel are entitled to in the course of their employment.
  - 1.1.4. Monitoring the students to adhere to the rules and regulations of REVA University.
  - 1.1.5. Regular interaction with university to understand the training progression.
  - 1.1.6. To provide the schedule of upcoming program schedule and personnel detail.
- 1.2. The obligations of REVA are as follows:
  - 1.2.1. To conduct the Training Program for Duster's personnel based on REVA's research and best suiting the needs of the Business.
  - 1.2.2. Providing monitoring, mentoring and certification to the designed courses.

### 2. TERM AND TERMINATION

# Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

TVET Authority (TVETA) of the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan

# REVA University, Bangalore, Karnataka, India

The Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVET Authority) or (TVETA) of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan and Reva University of the Republic of India hereinafter referred to singularly as the "Party" and collectively as the

Noting that cooperation in the academic areas is important for the improvement of "Parties", both countries;

Desiring to strengthen the academic cooperation between the two countries; and Considering the mutual benefits of both parties;

Have reached the following understanding:

### Article 1

# **Objectives**

The main objective of this MoU is to establish a mutually beneficial relationship built on academic cooperation. The areas of cooperation between TVET Authority of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan (hereinafter referred to as TVETA) and REVA University (hereinafter referred to as Host Institution) include developing academic cooperation and human resource development. This cooperation is in the form of a one-year technical training program, which should be customized to the needs and learning objectives of the new TVETA curricula in the fields of Business Administration, Accounting, Agronomy, Horticulture, Auto-repair, Computer Science/ICT and Civil & Commercial Construction. This cooperation can also include other fields and other areas of cooperation in the future, such as educational trainings to host Afghan teachers (hereinafter referred to as 'students'), upon mutual agreement by TVETA and REVA University. It is very important that the concentration of one-year technical trainings should be on practical learning of trade competencies, with more than 60% of the practical learnings to take place in the actual technical workshops, excluding non-technical fields.

### Article 2

### Forms of Cooperation

The **Parties** agree to provide opportunities, as appropriate, for the following activities towards the completion of the objective of this MoU.

- i. Reva University agrees to provide learning facilities, course materials, academic and administrative support to 'students' in the best possible environment which is conducive to learning at the **Reva University** the length of the agreed upon one-year technical training program.
- ii. TVETA agrees to select suitable and qualified students from Afghanistan for the duration of the agreed upon training program and send them to the Host Institution premises.
- iii. There will be a Joint Monitoring Group (JMG) comprising of representatives from Embassy of Afghanistan, TVETA and Host Institution who will be responsible for monitoring the progress and sustainability of course(s) and enforce corrections when necessary, on mutually acceptable basis.

### Article 3

### Scope

### The scope of the MOU encompasses:

a) Successful conduct and completion of a one-year technical training program for qualified Afghan Nationals in manageable groups in the fields of: Business Administration, Accounting, Agronomy, Horticulture, Autorepair, Computer Science/ICT and Civil & Commercial Construction, as well as other fields, if requested in the future by TVETA and the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan for educational purposes. Naturally the requests must be a mutually agreed upon endeavor

- b) The types, duration, eligibility and other matters regarding upcoming Technical Training Programs should be modified mutually, based on future needs.
- c) The JMG will make additional recommendations intended to enhance the scope of the MoU, such as including other academic activities as mutually agreed.
- d) The already specified responsibilities of both Parties, as well as the financial obligations as agreed upon, will be reviewed by the JMG when required.
- e) Neither the termination nor the expiry of this MoU will affect the validity of any already agreement upon activities, which may arrive at the beginning, at the conclusion of the negotiations or while the negotiations are in progress, pursuant to this MoU.
- f) The persons designated in this MoU are the sole representatives of their respected \arties and authorized to communicate their feedbacks, aspirations, and represent on behalf of their Party, unless otherwise officially communicated in written format.
- g) Students may enroll in the following disciplines and fields of study:

- h) TVETA is responsible for all its students' required academic and living expenses as previously agreed upon with the Host Institution. Any and all changes to fee structure or amount must be communicated well in advance to TVETA and no new or additional fees will be applied for an already agreed upon program or a program already in progress.
- i) The designated focal point(s) of the Host will assist TVETA students with securing housing, and offer personal and academic support prior to and during the one-year training program, until the completion of the program.
- j) All other expenses not mentioned below will be the responsibility of the student. The following student expenses will be the responsibility of TVETA:
  - i. Travel expenses (only the first arrival and the last departure)

- ii. Medical insurance required by the host institution (dental and skin care would not be covered)
- iii. Pocket allowance
- iv. Passport and visa fees
- v. Required student services fees at the host institution
- vi. English language proficiency course fees (if required)
- vii. Accommodation and food allowances
- viii. Training materials, practical learning equipment and academic supplies
  - ix. Expenses of site visits and field trips
  - x. Academic administrative fees, if any

### Article 4

Responsibilities of Host Institution (Reva University)

- a) Reva University will enroll all the students who are introduced by TVETA, with the objective of providing the students with a one-year technical training program in one of the specified fields listed above, based on an agreed upon customized training program, which must literally follow a syllabus that is mutually prepared and agreed upon
- b) The Host Institution will provide proficiency English language classes designed for better comprehension of students' English-abilities in technical training. These English courses should be conducted in parallel with other technical training program for a period of at least four months from the start of the technical training program. Fees for this program, once agreed upon at the beginning, will be charged by the Host Institution and paid by TVETA.
  - c) At the end of the one-year technical training program, the Host Institution will organize and conduct a ten-day certification program on new pedagogies in Outcome Based Education (OBE) and Student Centered Learning (SCL) methods, to the assigned Afghan students on a mutually agreed upon fee structure.
  - d) The Host Institution will formulate course curriculum as and when required based on mutual agreement as well as the Host Institution is expected to assess the theoretical and practical learning outcomes of students periodically during the training as agreed in the training syllabus. The result of such assessments should be shared with the TVETA on regular basis.

- e) To provide and extend equal opportunities and courtesy academically and otherwise to Afghan students, to the extent possible, as available to the Indian students.
- f) Communicate all financial liabilities to the Afghan Government at least three (3) months in advance to facilitate timely arrival of funds to Reva University and to ensure an uninterrupted program flow.
- g) Provide suitable infrastructures and administrative facilities such as library, labs, workshops etc. to TVETA students, to the extent possible in the campus.
- h) To ensure due respect to the institute rules and regulations, as well as local ethnic, racial and religious sentiments, the Host will communicate to TVET a list of all necessary and need to know rules, regulations and cultural sensitivities before the students' departure.
- i) Ensures the availability of recreational, sports and extracurricular facilities available in the campus, to all students equally.
- j) Critical and in-patient medical services for students are covered through the student medical insurance plan, which would be arranged by the Host Institution and paid for by TVETA. However, it will be the responsibility of the student to get the claim form and pay for his/her immediate medical bill. Ensure OPD medical services at the Host health centre during the TVETA students' stay on the campus, as is made available to all other students on fee basis.
- k) To ensure the availability of all facilities in terms of safety, security and hygiene to the extent possible, as is made available to other students.
- 1) The Host Institution will provide TVETA students with suitable board and lodging facilities with basic amenities, inside the campus, on par with what is available to Indian students. If TVETA requests special board and lodging, the same will be made available on request, once payment for same is made well in time.
- m) Administration of the Host Institution will make efforts to foster a better understanding and relationship between Afghan and Indian students, 5 | Page

- culminating into mutual respect for each other's national identity and pride, subject to rules and regulations of the university.
- n) The Host Institution will provide academic progress reports of each student to the TVETA at the end of each quarter.
- o) The Host Institution will organize industrial site visits for TVETA students so they are exposed to large industries in the relevant trade.

### Article 5 TVETA Responsibilities

- a) TVETA will select suitable and qualified students as per requested eligibility (both academic and medical) required for specific course described by the Host Institution while also being adaptive to the local environment.
- b) Submit timely documents such as passport, visa, medical insurance and other documents which are required by the Government of India.
- c) TVETA students will be screened to ensure they are familiar with the Indian culture, food, customs and conditions so they can adapt better and faster.
- d) The TVETA will deliver a pre-departure orientation session to the students to ensure that the students have basic familiarity with the Indian culture and customs.
- e) Each student is required to abide by all the rules and regulations of the Host Institution and the Government of India.
- f) If a student engages in activities contrary to the policy, rules & regulations of the Host Institution, he/she will be subject to expulsion from Reva University, introduced to Embassy of Afghanistan (in coordination with Indian Authorities) for prosecution under the Afghan laws and may be deported back to Afghanistan.
- g) Ensure respect to Indian ethnic and religious sentiments.

- h) Students' documents including but not limited to nominations, academic records, applications etc. required by the Host Institution, will be provided by the appropriate offices of TVETA.
- i) Monetary liability of the course will be deposited at Reva University at least one month in advance, failure to do so may result in the low progress of student's academic and other services including residential / food etc. provided by the university.
- j) It will be TVETA's responsibility to get clearance from the relevant Ministries in Afghanistan to ensure timely departure of the students.
- k) Any other costs incurred including fee for the back logs, reappears, tuition fee in case the student does not complete the program on time, damage to the university property, electricity usage beyond the permissible limit, charges for extra optional courses/ tours / industry visits/ internships etc. has to be borne by student.
- 1) Expenditure for any chemical/lab equipment etc. required by student, beyond the permissible limit of the university, has to be borne by student.

### Article 6 Dependents

The obligations of each party under this MoU are limited to students with TVETA scholarship and do not extend to spouses or dependents except female students. For female students, the cost of *Mahram* (husband) will be covered under the scholarship and will be limited to roundtrip airfare, accommodation and food allowance. Other expenses of accompanying spouses and dependents are the responsibility of the student. However, TVETA and the Reva University may facilitate the Visa with the concerned departments issuing Visa for the spouses and dependents especially for female students with family as per the rules and regulations of university and Indian Government.

#### Article 7

#### Number of Students and their Eligibility

The number of qualified students to be enrolled in the one year training program will be subject to mutual agreement between the two Parties.

#### **Article 8**

#### **Financial Arrangement**

The financial arrangement will be included as annex for each batch of the program. The training institute will be asked to submit their financial proposal based on the number of students and the field, and then upon mutual agreement, the costing of the program would be agreed between both Parties before the enrollment of students. The budget will include tuition fee, roundtrip airfare, accommodation cost, training materials, transportation/industrial visit costs, pocket money etc.

#### Article 10

#### Applicable Law and Jurisdiction

The Parties choose their addresses mentioned in Article 9 of this MoU as their respective domicile for purposes of any notices or legal process that may be served in terms of this MoU. All questions, disputes or differences arising out of or in connection with the MoU shall be governed by Afghan and Indian Laws, both procedural and substantive and will be subject to exclusive jurisdiction of Courts at India and Afghanistan.

#### Article 11

#### Third Party Beneficiary Rights

The Parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of a third party beneficiary, and this MoU will not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this MoU will be applicable only on the parties to this MoU. The provisions of this MoU are intended only to assist the Parties in determining and performing their obligations under this MoU. The Parties to this MoU intend and expressly agree that only parties signatory to this MoU will have any legal or equitable right to enforce this MoU, to seek any remedy arising from either party's failure to fulfill any term or condition of this MoU, or to take action for breaching this MoU.

#### Article 12

#### **Indemnity**

Both Parties will indemnify and hold their employees/representatives harmless against all losses, claims, costs and legal expenses, arising under or in relation to this MoU.

#### Article 13

#### **Participation in Similar Activities**

This MoU in no way restricts the Parties from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.

#### Article 14

#### **Additions and Amendments**

No adjustment, addition, renewal or cancellation of this MoU will be effective unless reduced to writing as an addendum to this MoU and signed by the Parties or their duly authorized signatories. Changes to this MoU will be made by mutual consent between both institutions.

#### Article 15

#### **Dispute Resolution**

Any difference arising from the interpretation or application of this Memorandum will be resolved through mutual consultations between parties. The Parties agree that any disputes, disagreements, issues or complaints that may arise from the execution or interpretation of this MoU will be resolved amicably by mutual consultation. In case such resolution is not possible, then the unresolved dispute or difference will be referred to a committee consisting of two members from each Parties appointed by their Heads of the organization, and the decision of the committee will be binding upon both Parties. In case, the Parties do not reach a clear solution, the heads of both Parties should mutually resolve dispute.

#### Article 16

#### **Entry into Force, Duration and Termination**

1. The MoU will enter into force after the date of receipt, through diplomatic channels, of the last written notification by which the Parties notify each other of the completion of their internal procedures required for the entry into force of this MoU. It is worth noting that the training program will be of (1) year for each batch of students.

- 2. This MoU will remain in force for the period agreed upon. On the anniversary of the MoU, Reva University will submit a brief report indicating any imbalances in student numbers and/or other issues or programs.
- 3. This MoU may be extended, with the written consent of both Parties, for a period beyond its original date of expiry. Either Party may terminate this MoU any time by serving written notice to the other Party. Such termination will take effect four months from the date of the written notice.
- 4. The Termination and expiration of this MoU will not affect the terms of activities ongoing at the time of notification of termination and expiration unless otherwise agreed upon between the Parties.

Subject: Grant of Advance to Nodal Centres for organising Smart India Hackathon 2019 Hardware Edition

- Each team has 6 members (hereafter referred as team members), two mentors (mentors may be
  professors of team's institute or anyone who has a minimum qualifications of Masters). Each
  Nodal Centre would have a few Design Mentors who would guide the students on designing a
  market ready product during the 5 day long hackathon (hereafter referred as Design Mentors).
  Nodal Centre heads would be MIC/AICTE/i4C/Persistent officials or officials from outside but
  approved by competent authority.
- 2. For organising the hackathon, each Nodal Centre will be provided an advance grant amount of Rs 15 Lacs per institute/organisation for arranging the logistics.
- 3. Grants under various heads would be provided to Nodal Centres, which can be utilised as per the following guidelines:
  - i. Grant for Travel reimbursement of Teams: Travel reimbursements will be given to team members and mentors, if any. Each team has upto 8 members (6 Students and 2 Mentors). Each member will be provided reimbursement for Sleeper Class Train Tickets for the shortest route. If someone travels in flight an amount equivalent to travel fare for Sleeper Class Train Tickets will be paid as reimbursement. Local travel can also be covered under this head, provided teams produce tickets of local travel. Local travel reimbursement will be provided only if the students travel in Govt/Private buses and produce bills on actuals. Nodal Center can also claim reimbursement of local travel facility to students under this head. However, Nodal Centre should produce the actual bills/Vouchers for the same.
  - ii. Local Travel of Design Mentors/Organising Official/Juries assigned by AICTE: Only local travel will be given to the design mentors or for any official approved by MIC under this grant.
  - iii. Stay Arrangements:

Students: Each student/mentor shall be provided stay at the Nodal Centre. Nodal Centre should make stay arrangements for students in their Hostel. An amount of Rs 300 per student/ per day will be provided to Nodal Centre for the same. Each Student shall be allowed to stay from 7<sup>th</sup> July early morning to 13<sup>th</sup> July late evening i.e. 6 nights. Nodal Centre cannot claim charges towards stay of Students beyond these days.

Mentors: Each team is eligible for maximum of 2 mentors. The stay guidelines for mentors is same as students.

Design Mentors and MSME/AICTE Juries: Nodal Centres shall make stay arrangements for Design Mentors at their guest house or nearby hotels. Design Mentors will not be provided stay beyond 7<sup>th</sup> July to 13<sup>th</sup> July (6 nights). If any design mentor wants to stay for more days, logistics have to be taken care by themselves. Cost per day of stay for design mentor will not exceed Rs1500.

Nodal Centre Heads: Stay for organising officials i.e. SIH Nodal Centre Heads will be arranged by AICTE Regional Offices. If regional office requests the centre to arrange for stay of any officials at their centre, Regional office would reimburse the cost on

basis of bills/ vouchers and it would not be covered under this grant. Coordination with the concerned Regional Office would be required in that case.

Officials of Participating Industries/Ministries: No stay of the officials from any private company /Ministry officials will be covered under this grant. These officials shall bear their own accommodation costs.

- iv. Food Arrangements: Each Student/Official/Design Mentor shall be provided food by the Nodal Centre as per the guidelines received from Smart India Hackathon organising team (refer Organiser Manual Hardware Edition). The cost of food/snacks/tea should be between Rs 500-650 per day per participant/official.
- v. Expenditure on Bill of Materials (BOM): Each team would be provided some input materials, as asked by the team through a BOM, which may be purchased or rented, based on the availability. Nodal centres shall provide the details of purchase (separate registers and entries to be maintained for this grant) on actuals to AICTE for final settlement. Any consumable/non-consumable purchased under this head will be owned by AICTE only, and by Nodal Centre. However, any consumable/non-consumable item purchased under this head and costing less than Rs 5000 can be given to students after making entries in respective issue register with signature of students. The Nodal Centre will be reimbursed for purchasing those materials, the list of which are given by AICTE. Due diligence would be practiced by Nodal Centre to ensure that the purchase price for these items is fair and justifiable.
- vi. Purchase of Banner/Decorating Materials/Video Graphic/Web Casting: A lump sum amount of Rs 2 Lacs per Nodal Centre is sanctioned under this head for purchase of banners, decorating materials, videography, other contingencies as may be required by Nodal Centre.
- vii. Printing/Xerox: Cost towards Printing of IDs for all the stakeholders, Certificates of all the participants, volunteers and other officials will be met through this grant. Grant of Rs 25,000 is sanctioned per Nodal Centre under this head.
- viii. Miscellaneous: An amount of Rs 1 Lac can be used by Nodal Center for meeting miscellaneous expenses incurred by Nodal Centre. However, reimbursement under this head would be made only after Nodal Centre shares justification of these expenses.
- ix. Purchase of PCs, Tables, Covers or any Non Consumables if not specified under any head mentioned above may not be allowed under this grant.
- x. Purchase of Certificate/Dummy Cheques/Gifts/Mementoes etc: The purchase of certificates/dummy cheques/gifts/mementos etc is only allowed for those problem statements belongs to AICTE or Student Innovation category.
