
Description of Event:

Many women feel the pressures of gender discrimination and comparatively less confidence, while others have become accustomed to being treated inferior to men.

SESSION:

As a part of WGRC-(Women Grievance Redressal Cell) an initiative was taken to organize, in association with HUL (Hindustan Unilever limited) , a grooming session mainly for the girl students of Under Graduate and Post Graduate students. The program started at 10:45 and got over at 12:45 pm.

Ms. Sowmya spoke about how important it is for a girl or women to carry herself in a proper manner, she even spoke about the way of dressing, talking, styling herself, and most importantly her confidence level for indulging in activities. Ms. Sowmya guided us with the help of a video which further gave us a clearer view about what she exactly wanted to convey. She even spoke about how important it is to avoid body odour, which clearly stated that not just dressing up well is important but the way we smell, talk, walk, smile, maintain eye contact and body language also matters. Ms. Sowmya also distributed Rexona 10X among all the girls, to spread awareness about self-care. 80 girl students from both UG and PG attended this session.

In association with CMCA, Bangalore, **Campus Yuva** Workshop on the theme **"Equity & Gender"** was conducted on 31st November 2019 for First year Architecture students. Ms. Rohini and Mr. Arjun of CMCA conducted a four-hour workshop.

In order to be an efficient Architect in this diverse field of work, an Architect has to deal with a varied mix people from different dimensions like Clients, Co-workers, Engineers, Contractors, Masons, Carpenters, Plumbers etc. The workshop highlighted the vital issue of gender inclusivity concerning this field of work. Contrary to thought, women actually play a very crucial role in this otherwise patriarchal profession. The workshop presented an excellent and unbiased view on this to sensitize students towards the same.

Morning session started with students filling in a questionnaire relating to social issues in the society and their views on them. Then different scenarios of physical and mental abuse were exhibited in front the students and was elaborately discussed. Students were then made to rethink the answers for the questionnaire.

Afternoon session focused on discrimination like caste, gender, status, job hierarchy, and language and importance of equity in our current society. Students were made to enact different scenarios on discrimination.

Campus Yuva workshop provided an avenue for young people to acquire an understanding of rights & obligations as citizens and life skills such as critical thinking, teamwork & communication. It aimed at equipping students with skills to enable them to be effective and responsible individuals & citizens of the society.

Legal Aid outreach program

School of Legal Studies, REVA University has attempted a Legal Aid outreach program on village survey at Kommasandra village, Devanahalli, Taluk, Bangalore Rural District on 11.1.2020 by visiting door to door and got the data on the classes of personal information and family information of the Houses including Domestic information, Village information, and village issues/ problems through the agenda design. The 68 law students have taken an interest in this occasion. The students procured information on social concerns and the spirit of the village culture and they roused to take up the difficulties to take care of the issues confronting society.

Conferring legitimate mindfulness was the primary target of this outreach program. The group interfaced with individuals from the village and gathered information and sources of info in regards to the issues that existed and made mindfulness on the legal services accessible so it enables them to use them at their will. Some of the main concerns voiced by the villagers were proper roads, water, drainage, transport, Grama Sabha, and health care centers to be built. Law students additionally associated with Advocate and Gram Panchayath Mr. Ramanjanaiah K.H and another Gram Panchayat Member N. Manjunath, from the same village concerning different legal issues and the difficulties that existed in the village. With everything taken into account, the program and survey were worthwhile as the students as well as the Professors got knowledge into the issues looked at by regional India which would empower them to usefully move in the direction of resolving them.

Dr. Nagaraja V, Professor, who is the Co-ordinator of REVA Legal Aid Clinic guided the students to carry out this outreach program in a methodical way. Prof. Venkataswamy, Assistant Professor of the School of Commerce and Management Studies of REVA University supported this program. The faculty of Prof. Raghavendra G., Pallavi Sen, Dr.Kumara J N, and Prof. Soujanya encouraged the students during the visit.



The School of Architecture, REVA University in collaboration with Campus 2 Community organised a community outreach program from 20th to 23rd September 2019 at Channarayapatana , Naganayakanalli , Janatha colony ,Channahalli , Jalige , Rajagatta , Beer Sandra and Tinglu village. Description:

Village activities to create awareness related to health and hygiene in Bandikodegahalli Gram Panchayat

The NSS unit - REVA University organised village activities to **create awareness related to health and hygiene in Bandikodegahalli Gram Panchayat-Villages"** on Wednesday, 29th January, 2020 between 9.30 A M to 12 9M. Around 25 students participated in this drive.

Sanitation and hygiene are critical to health, survival, and development. Many countries are challenged in providing adequate sanitation for their entire populations, leaving people at risk for water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH)-related diseases. Throughout the world, an estimated 2.4 billion people lack basic sanitation (more than 32% of the world's population). Basic sanitation is described as having access to facilities for the safe disposal of human waste (feces and urine), as well as having the ability to maintain hygienic conditions, through services such as garbage collection, industrial/hazardous waste management, and wastewater treatment and disposal. In this regard, REVA University conducted awareness program related to health and hygiene in rural areas.







BLOOD DONATION CAMP

Despite a huge population, the demand-supply gap for blood units persists in many healthcare facilities in the country. According to a 2012 report by the World Health Organization, only 9 million blood units are available annually, whereas the demand is 12 million units. Voluntary blood donation comprises about 70% of the blood demand, with the rest coming from replacement donors, whereas 62 nations in the world fulfil their blood demands through voluntary donations.

In view of all these aspects, a blood donation camp was organised by the School of Mechanical and Civil Engineering on February 19, 2020. The Blood donation Camp was organised in association with Jeeva Raksha voluntary Blood bank and Lions club of Bangalore (Dist-317A). More than 590 units of Blood was collected. Along with the blood donation, a free medical check-up was conducted. It included free eye check-up, dental test, sugar test, BP test and ECG test. Many needy students and faculties made use of this facility.

The arrangement for all the above activities was done systematically and the volunteers served their best to conduct the program successfully and the huge turnout was due to the effective communication carried on by our volunteer student groups, this inspired many of them to donate the blood for a good cause.



MODERN FOOD INDUSTRIES LTD

INDUSTRIAL VISIT

The school of legal studies had organized a visit to the regional branch of Modern Food Industries (India) Ltd on 28th of November 2019.

Modern Food Industries (India) Ltd (MFIL) was set up in 1965 as Modern Bakeries (India) Limited situated at Kazhikundram, Taramani (Near Tidel Park). It was set up under the Colombo plan. It got its present name in 1982. MFIL had bread manufacturing units in 13 cities spread across India. MFIL had also marketed fruit juice concentrate under brand name Rasika in Delhi. MFIL also produced aerated soft drinks under the brand Double Seven. MFIL was a wholly owned Central Government-owned PSU. It was taken over by Hindustan Lever Limited in January 2000. This was the first privatisation of public sector unit by the government of India. Modern Foods had over 40% of the bread market in India.

HUL was the sole bidder for Modern Foods. It paid Rs 10.5 million, as per the valuation exercise undertaken by its valuer ICICI, for 74% of the shares. Later the government exercised its put option to sell the remaining 26% to HUL for Rs 4.4 million in November 2002. In 2006, HUL merged MFIL with itself. Senior HUL officials said the acquisition was a complete misfit with the HUL culture and systems. The company had admitted that the acquisition was a mistake on account of improper due diligence.

In 2001, HUL referred MFIL to Board of Industrial and Financial Reconstruction. Subsequently HUL decided to sell the company to Singapore based Everstone Capital. In April 2016 Modern changed hands again, this time to Everstone Capital. Today the company is called Modern Foods Enterprises Pvt. Ltd. and is 100% owned by Everstone Capital.

The students were addressed by the Hr.Manager & Production Manager of Modern Food Industries (India) Ltd, who shared the hierarchy of the organisation, HR policy and Production process, Quality Mgt etc, which are the most important aspects of employees and production .

The students were taken to the various departments such as production, HR and marketing department and students were given concrete exposure to the Modern Food Industries (India) Ltd. girie



29th and 30th April, 2019



Report on "Cleaning up of Non-Biodegradable Wastes at Nandi Hills"


