



Report on Five Day Workshop on Spoken English 23rd to 27th July -2018

The School of Arts & Humanities organized a **5-day workshop on Spoken English** for interested **administrative and support staff of REVA University** from **Monday 23rd to Friday 27th July 2018**. The workshop was free of cost and certificates were provided to all the regularly attending participants.

The workshop aimed at exposing the participants to important words, phrases and sentences in English to help in their day-to-day communication with students, teachers, parents and other stakeholders. It was organised under the able guidance of Dr. Payel Dutta Chowdhury, Director, School of Arts & Humanities. Prof Pratiksha Mangalekar was the faculty-in-charge for the workshop. It was conducted in Seminar Hall, Seventh Floor, Vivekananda Block, REVA University from 02:00 to 04:00 pm and twenty participants registered for the same.

Day one focussed on ice-breaking sessions and self-introduction. Suggestions were given to introduce themselves effectively and uniquely. It was facilitated by Prof Pratiksha Mangalekar. On day two the participants got to know each other a little better. Prof Anupama BN facilitated the sessions by forming pairs, quickly getting to know one's partner and introducing him/her to others. Day three dealt with describing pictures. This helped the participants to learn the necessary vocabulary and phrases in order to describe anything. The session was facilitated by Prof Prasad Gowda. The session on day four was Telephonic Conversations / Telephonic etiquettes. It was conducted by Prof Sumathi Nagesh which focussed on ways and manners of official and unofficial telephonic conversations. The last day of the workshop dealt with Common Spoken English Mistakes conducted by Prof Nasreen Ghani. She clarified several doubts expressed by the participants.

The sessions in the workshop comprised of several related activities and exercises. The facilitators actively engaged the participants in speaking activities. We observed a noticeable change in the participants' spoken English levels. The participants expressed that they were more confident and comfortable to speak in English post- Spoken English Workshop.

Students actively participated in question and answer session and expressed that the webinar was a great learning experience.

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How to help someone who is suicidal?

- When in doubt, ask (E.g., "*Sometimes when people feel very disturbed, they think of suicide. Have you had such thoughts?*")
- Allow the person space and time to respond. But be persistent.
- Talk to the person alone. Pay attention.
- Respond with empathy and non-judgmentally (E.g., *I'm sorry you feel so hopeless...* vs. "*You shouldn't think this way*")
- Offer help (E.g., "*Is there something I can do to help you?*")
- Encourage them to seek professional help

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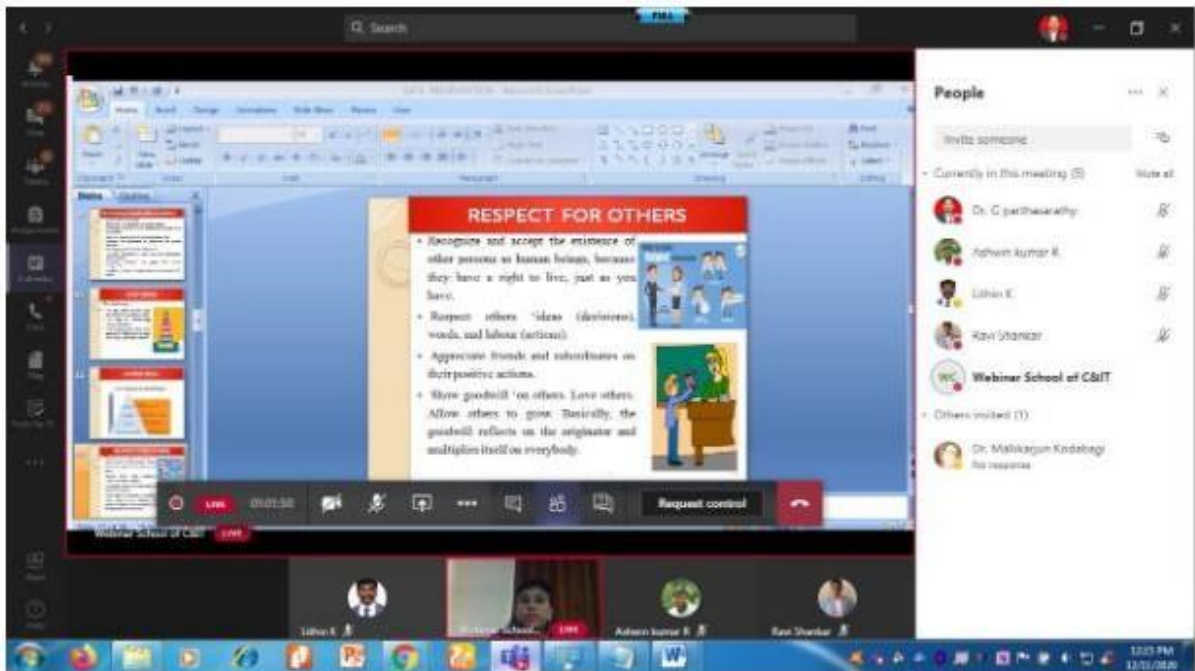
