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## About REVA University

REVA University is a State Private University established in Karnataka State under the Government of Karnataka Act No. 13 in the year 2013 in Bengaluru, the IT capital of India. REVA University is recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC); approved by the AICTE and accredited by NAAC. At QS Asian University Rankings 2023, REVA is ranked 6th among State Private Universities in Karnataka and 47th in India.

REVA University prides itself in contributing to every student's holistic development. The University currently offers 39 full-time Undergraduate Programs, 32 full-time Post Graduate Programs, and 18 Ph.D. Programs, and certificate and diploma Programs. The University offers Programs under the faculty of Engineering, Architecture, Science and Technology, Commerce, Management Studies, Law, Arts and Humanities, and Performing Arts and Indic Studies. REVA University facilitates research leading to a Doctoral Degree in all disciplines. 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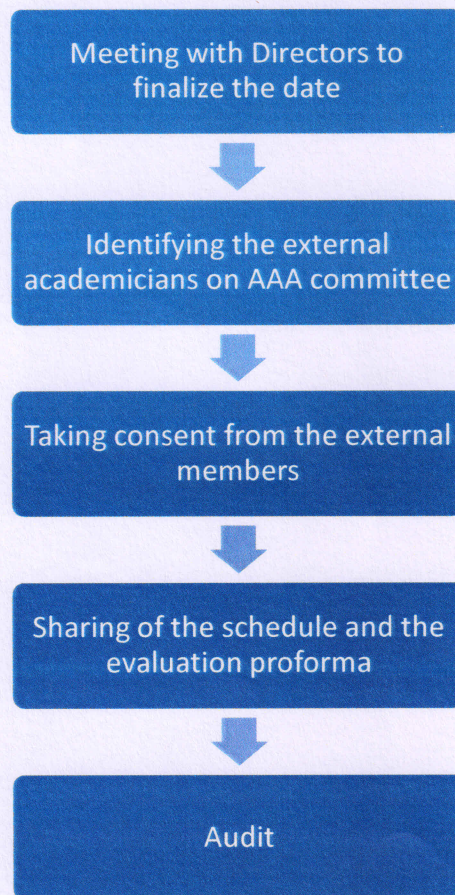
## Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA)

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## Report:

The meeting of the AAA committee was fixed on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2023. The AAA committee was assisted by the IQAC members to conduct the audit. The committee had a formal meeting with the Vice Chancellor, Registrar, Pro Vice Chancellor, Directors, and Deans. During the meeting, the overview of the University, developments, and achievements made was presented. Members of the committee were briefed about the objective of the audit and the procedure involved.

The members visited the schools, and the infrastructural facilities in the schools such as classrooms, and laboratories, and interacted with the teaching staff and the technical staff to know the academic and administrative performance. All the related documents were presented to the members. After completing all stages of inspection and interactions in the schools. The AAA report covering the observations was prepared for the respective schools by the members. Individual school evaluation sheets are enclosed with this report.

Also, the members visited the central facilities such as the Examination section, Computer center, Placement Cell, Library, and Auditorium, and had interactions with the coordinators. Other general facilities were also verified.

The committee after completing all stages of inspection and interactions prepared the AAA report for the University covering the summarized observations and recommendations.

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### Observations of Auditors:

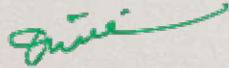
- The organization chart must be updated.
- ICT Facilities should be listed.
- Mandatory disclosures should be uploaded on the website with the signatures of the Director IQAC and Registrar.
- Proceedings of meetings must be signed by the Member Secretary and Chairman
- Notifications can be notified by Chancellor, VC, Registrar, etc about the constitution of committee members, proceedings, ATR, and MOM.
- Fund allocation to R & D must be scientifically increased.
- Infrastructure augmentation must be improved.
- Faculty and Staff welfare measures must be notified clearly with year-wise beneficiaries.
- Quarterly budget allocation and expenditure must be documented schedule of expenditure charts must be given.
- Records to be checked – Percentage of students having grievances about the examination process.
- Records to be checked Percentage of students who applied for re-evaluation.
- Records to be checked – Percentage of students successful in re-evaluation.
- Records to be checked - Percentage of variation in marks.
- IQAC cell must be active with a office establishment.
- The number of faculty with a Ph.D. degree must be increased.
- An energy audit must be done by the authorized agency.
- Green Audit must be initiated.
- The consolidated program offered list should be at the beginning of the academic year.

### Observations and Suggestions by the Vice-Chancellor:

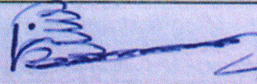
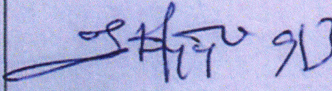
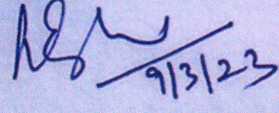
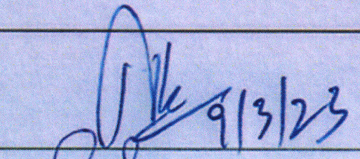
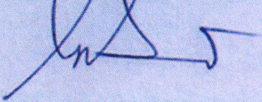
